I. INTRODUCTION

Perhaps the most remarkable fact about the Public Buildings Inventory is that it has only now come into existence. That the federal, state, and city governments possessed buildings within New York City that are internationally renowned for their architectural quality was a commonplace. What the Inventory establishes for the first time is that the three branches of government own many hundreds of lesser known buildings of substantial architectural merit. The extent and variety of these buildings were not anticipated.

The task as outlined at the start by the Conservancy was deceptively simple: find the total number of federal, state, and city buildings within New York City, select from among them those with architectural merit, and record them. With the help of forty-eight different agencies of government, a composite master list of almost 29,000 properties was finally assembled. By excluding vacant land and residential buildings, the candidate list was reduced to five thousand, and by verification of the dates of construction, to two thousand buildings throughout the city. Each of the two thousand buildings was seen and evaluated. Seven hundred sixty buildings of architectural interest were photographed.

At this point, the most fundamental, if somewhat philosophical, question in the field of preservation had to be faced--what is worth saving? This issue was addressed comprehensively in the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. Criteria for National Register eligibility were established for buildings, districts, sites, structures, and objects. The general standard of quality, or "significance," was that the buildings ". . . possess integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling and association."

Further, specific findings had to be made. Buildings must ". . . embody distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction, or . . . represent the work of a master, or . . . possess high artistic values, or . . . represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction."

As a guideline to selecting buildings for the Inventory, the Conservancy decided to vary from the findings of "significance" required for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places.

The focus is exclusively upon architectural rather than historic value, but not necessarily upon integrity in the strict preservationist sense. That a building may have been altered does not disqualify it from the Inventory. Distinctive characteristics were sought but design standards not rigidly imposed. An ordinary building could be selected because it indicated a particular New York style, served a peculiar function, or had a single notable detail. Since the surrounding environment was not evaluated, a building could be included even if it were on an otherwise valueless block.

The consequence of the decisions made and the process employed is that the Inventory is a more inclusive and personal document than one that would have emerged from a strict historical survey. The appeal of the Inventory lies in the fact that the diverse character and individuality of the city's communities are broadly represented. These buildings are readily recognizable and perform a daily service to the local residents. They represent an aspect of New York that links each of us, in a physical way, both to the richness of the past and to the vigor of the present.

Certain specific findings from the Inventory are notable as well. It becomes clear that Government has been one of the truly great patrons of architecture throughout the history of the city. The most prominent architects of the day--Calvert Vaux, Napoleon Le Brun, Cass Gilbert, Richard M. Hunt, Frank Freeman, John R. Thomas, Carrère and Hastings--have all been called upon. Not surprisingly the firm of McKim, Mead and White has built a complete catalogue of building types and styles throughout the city--from the lofty Hall of Fame,

United States General Post Office and Municipal Building, to the more modest Chatham Square and 115th Street branch libraries to the lowly but highly functional Bronx Grit Chamber. Less obvious, but perhaps more influential, are the routine buildings designed by lesser known and sometimes anonymous architects. Almost seventy-five percent of the buildings in the Inventory perform a narrowly local or neighborhood function. These buildings tend to dispel the conventional notion that public buildings are uniformly monumental, remote, and authoritative. Instead these are modest and exert a stabilizing influence in every neighborhood of the city.

That a building is publicly-owned and perhaps even a designated landmark does not necessarily guarantee its survival. While most of these buildings are fully utilized, many are only partially occupied and some are completely abandoned. During the last year alone, the city sold at public auction twelve buildings that are now in the Inventory.

Obviously, buildings that have architectural merit and have become obsolete can only be saved by converting them to more efficient and productive uses. There are numerous examples in the Inventory, the most prominent of which are the Jefferson Market Courthouse, now a branch of the New York Public Library and the old Astor Library, a designated landmark, now the New York Shakespeare Festival Public Theater. Such conversions are extremely complicated but must become routine if the city is to continue the process of renewing itself.

Assumptions and Qualifications

A fundamental assumption is that architectural significance can be measured over a wide range of building types representing over 150 years of construction. The enormity of the selection procedure, together with the astonishing variety of buildings which has emerged, has led us to abandon the criteria for significance and rely upon a more general though subjective level of architectural interest as the final basis for selection. This shift in emphasis occurred largely as a result of a preliminary study of nationally established criteria for "significance." This study focused the development of criteria for significance upon an in-depth social, cultural, technical, and artistic history of each building. Such an undertaking would have been well beyond the scope of the Inventory. The study was initially expected to find few buildings throughout the entire city. Instead, 2,000 buildings were found. The selection of buildings is based solely on the physical aspects of each building and does not identify historic interest. The judgments regarding architectural qualities are aimed toward a more general level of "interest." These include important details, forms, styles, building type, or unusual functions as well as considerations of location and siting.

Not all of the buildings in the Inventory can be considered candidates for landmark designation. Architectural interest may not always be apparent from the photograph, due to the constraint of recording only one view of each building. Consequently, omissions may occur. The Inventory is to appeal to many interests--historians, architects, community people, and developers.

A qualification must be made regarding the distinction between public ownership and public use. Public ownership is defined as ownership by the federal, state, or city government. Public ownership also includes ownership by joint state-city agencies, such as The Triborough Bridge and Tunnel Authority and the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, of properties within New York City.

The term "public use" applies to buildings which were originally intended to accommodate government administration as facilities such as fire, police, schools, libraries, etc., or as public works facilities. All residential uses are excluded from consideration, as are military properties such as Fort

Totten, or because of their highly specialized functions, properties such as the Brooklyn Navy Yard. However, if a military property includes areas which are open to the general public and if these areas contain buildings which are considered surplus, they have been included for consideration in the study.

Buildings not originally intended for government use but which are now government property are also included, such as banks, office buildings, and churches. They have been acquired through condemnation or through tax-default proceedings.

An important assumption through the initial stages of the work has been that a comprehensive list of government-owned buildings would be available, that this list would contain basic data describing each building, and that this data would be reliable. Such was not the case.

The difficulties in establishing a reliable and comprehensive listing may have led to the omission of some buildings. Some information was not available in our sources, and we invite the reader's assistance in supplying it. Within the limits of information and verification procedures, however, all buildings of potential interest have been examined throughout the five boroughs.

II. METHODOLOGY

The Inventory was developed through a three-step procedure. The first was the preparation of a master list of all government properties in New York City. The second step was a preliminary screening of buildings from the master list. The third step was a final selection based upon standards of architectural interest. The first two steps relied upon information made available specifically for this study and upon published documents. The third step required trained architectural judgment.

The buildings selected for the Inventory have been compiled into a uniform, indexed record. This record includes building data (title, address, date of construction, architect, landmark status, borough, city planning district, owner, jurisdiction, tax block, and lot), maps, and a photograph of each selected building.

Preparation of the Master List

The sources of information and the type of information available are summarized in Table 2-1. This table is also a summary of the reliability of information presented in each listing. The data required for each building in the Inventory is listed at the top of the table. The combined sources listed 28,644 government-owned properties in New York City. They are:

- U.S. Government, General Services Administration: 87 properties.
- State of New York, Office of General Services: 387 properties.
- City of New York, Department of Real Estate: 28,170 properties.

These were supplied by various agencies in the form of computer printouts. Each was organized in a different manner, and the data were not always consistent or comparable.

Data on Federal properties included: borough, address, agency jurisdiction, and general property use description. Information regarding the number, use, and size of buildings on each property, the date of construction, architect, or status was not included.

Data on New York State properties included: borough, address, agency jurisdiction, property use description, number, and use of buildings on each property, and their status. Dates of construction, architect, or size of

each building were not included.

Data on properties owned by New York City included: borough, address, tax block and lot number, agency jurisdiction, property use description, and status. Building size and use, date of construction, and architect were not included.

Because each of these lists contained diverse data, a single master list had to be established. Using the city listings as a guide, the data on federal and state properties was translated to this format wherever possible. This unified record became the basis for verification and for the assembly of the final index.

Once the master list was compiled, the information had to be verified. Three major sources were used for the verification of data: Sanborn maps, operating agency listings, and published documents. These lists, their sources, and a summary of the data they contain are also presented in Table 2-1.

Whenever possible, all the data in the master list was cross-checked with the information contained in these verification listings. The data used for verification were incomplete in many cases. Many operating agencies could not supply a listing from their files; nor when supplied were these lists necessarily comprehensive. Often only buildings used by the agencies to carry out their principal functions were included. Other buildings, necessary for administration and support, were excluded. A further search through additional records and personal inquiry were required to complete the verification.

Many city-owned buildings were listed under the jurisdiction of the Board of Estimate rather than by an operating agency. Among the more than 14,000 properties held by the Board of Estimate, many vacated buildings were for sale by the city at public auction. Others were being held until urban renewal proceedings were completed.

The most important source for verification was the Sanborn Company maps. These are maps developed by a private company for the purpose of fire insurance underwriting. They are based upon the tax records assembled by the city.

Published documents include real-estate studies, landmark designation reports, historic guides, and operating agency yearly reports. The information was usually fragmentary though reliable.

The listings provided by the U.S. Government and the State of New York are part of the routine administration of properties. While the data in these was not necessarily in the desired format, it was generally reliable.

The creation of the verified master list evolved over considerable time. It was presumed that consistent and reliable records would be available. This was not the case. The erratic nature of the data required considerable work before the verified master list was complete.

Preliminary Screening

Selection of buildings was carried out in two distinct phases. The first was a preliminary screening based upon facts of ownership, use, and dates of construction. The screening criteria were:

- 1) that the building is currently owned by a public agency;
- 2) that the building is non-residential;
- 3) that the building was built before 1940.

Because of the time lag between the compilation of government property listings and the verification procedures of this study, the current ownership of each property had to be verified. Many properties have been placed on the auction block by the city during the study. Buildings originally designed to serve public functions are currently being divested. Other buildings, acquired for government use, are still in service. In addition, tax-exempt institutions often occupy government land while the building remains in private ownership; these buildings were excluded. Often properties are held by the city but the buildings erected on these are owned by the state or federal governments; these buildings were included.

The study was limited to non-residential buildings. Over 50% of city-owned buildings are residential. These would require a separate study. In addition, a substantial number of residential buildings come into city ownership through tax default proceedings. These are quickly sold. The focus of this study is therefore upon buildings intended for general use--which benefit public interests rather than the more private interests of single families.

The year 1940 was established as a cut-off date because it complies with the provisions of the Landmarks Preservation Law of New York City (NYC Administrative Code Chpt 8-A, Sect. 207-1.0 item N), which specifies that a structure must be at least thirty years old before it may be considered for designation.

By applying the first two criteria to the master list, the candidates were reduced to 5,000. The further exclusion of buildings constructed after 1940 reduced the total to 1,625 buildings.

An additional 400 buildings were included for which there was inadequate or incomplete information. By this screening process we arrived at roughly 2,000 candidate buildings to be visited for final selection.

Final Selection

The standard of identifiable architectural "interest" was applied to the 2,000 buildings listed throughout the five boroughs. This part of the selection procedure involved trained architectural judgment.

The original intent of the study had been to develop standards of "significance." But as the richness and variety of public buildings became apparent this was changed. Architectural interest could be a detail, form, type, or unusual function. The final criteria for determining architectural "interest" were:

- 1) Setting: the placement of a building on its site and of the relationship to the surrounding buildings. This would include a unique setting which enhances the topographic qualities of the site, buildings which closely match prevailing adjacent building lines, or buildings which follow the prevailing character of adjacent buildings, or buildings which stand out markedly.
- 2) Form and Type: the configuration of the building which results from its particular function. Many buildings have been designed as prototypical responses to a stated function. Others, housing the same functions, are designed in differing styles and configurations.
- 3) Scale and Proportion: scale is the size of the units of construction (bricks, blocks) and architectural details (doors, windows, cornices) which relate to the size of a person. Proportion is the size of the architectural elements and details relative to each other and to the size of the whole building. Scale is also determined by the building mass and how it relates to the size of open space. Included are

buildings of an intimate, almost domestic scale which blend in with their neighborhood as well as large and imposing buildings which stand as monuments.

Through this procedure, 760 of the 2,000 buildings were selected and are presented as the Public Buildings Inventory. The final selection of buildings is based upon physical characteristics only. The criteria developed for this step produced a selection of buildings which encompass a wide variety of architectural forms, styles, and details.

III. FINDINGS

The 760 buildings are representative of a variety of public facilities, settings, and construction periods throughout the five boroughs. Although representative of only a portion of buildings built for government use, they begin to illustrate the structure of public services throughout the city. Seventy percent of these buildings serve local needs.

Sixty-five buildings are designated landmarks. An additional thirteen are located in historic districts.

Ownership

The ownership of public buildings is summarized in Table 3-1. The patterns of ownership reflect not only the concentration of facilities in Manhattan, but the extent of public services throughout the city.

Forty-two buildings (5.5%) are owned and operated by agencies of the federal government. Thirty buildings (3.8%) are owned by New York State. Six hundred ninety-two (90.8%) buildings are owned and operated by New York City.

Use

The use of public buildings is summarized in Table 3-2, in which the buildings have been grouped into functional categories. These functions represent the total range of public services in New York City.

- School buildings (22.2%) are the most predominant in the Inventory. These include elementary, intermediate, junior high, senior high, and vocational training schools. Also included are Board of Education offices whenever these are housed in converted school buildings. Many trade and senior high schools draw students from an entire borough or across the city. The majority, however, are elementary schools dispersed throughout each borough. Of over 900 schools throughout the city, 603 are known to have been built before 1940. The Inventory includes 169 as representative of the range of types and qualities of design.
- Hospitals and health care facilities comprise 14.3% of buildings in the Inventory. They are often grouped into large complexes serving an entire borough or district. Bellevue Hospital and nearby Gouverneur Hospital serve Lower Manhattan. About one third of the buildings selected from Staten Island are concentrated in a few building groups, such as Seaview Hospital and the U.S. Public Health Hospital. These serve the entire city and can be distinguished from health centers which serve smaller populations.
- Fire houses also represent a significant proportion of public construction in the Inventory, 12.8%. Of the 200 known to have been built before 1940, 97 are of definite architectural interest.
- Facilities built for recreational and cultural purposes, 10.9% of the total, generally serve a district and borough constituency. They are typically located in the major parks or are separate recreation

centers. They include buildings such as the 72nd Street Boat House and the Zoo buildings in Central Park as well as the Sunset Park Recreation Center in Brooklyn and Astoria Park Center in Queens. Small park shelters and comfort station buildings have been excluded from the Inventory. As part of the metropolitan park system, the buildings of Central Park, Prospect Park, the Bronx Zoo, and the adjacent Botanical Gardens serve the entire city. But many of the recreation centers, indoor pools, and public baths are neighborhood oriented.

- Government administrative and judicial facilities also comprise 7.4% of the Inventory. Of the 56 buildings selected, 27 are in Manhattan.
- Fifty-five police stations, out of 61 known to have been built before 1940, comprise 7.2% of the Inventory. They are organized to serve several neighborhoods through precinct districting. Additional police-related buildings containing specialized functions (mounted troops, motorcycle division headquarters, or quartermaster stores) are dispersed throughout the city.
- Fifty-two public libraries, out of 68 known to have been built before 1940, account for 6.8% of the buildings in the Inventory. Libraries in Manhattan, the Bronx, and Richmond are part of the New York Public Library system with its central library at Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street. Queens Borough Public Library and the Brooklyn Public Library are also organized around a central library.
- Public works facilities include 42 buildings, 5.5%, such as sewage treatment plants, sanitation facilities, aqueduct pump houses, reservoir gate houses, transit yards, and power substations for the subway system. Each of these is part of a larger physical network of services which link the entire city.
- Higher education facilities include 32 buildings, 4.2% of the Inventory. Twelve are in Manhattan, concentrated in the City College campus. Several college campuses have been developed around older pre-existing buildings. Of these, the Bronx Community College is a notable example.
- Twenty-four military buildings, or 3.2% of the Inventory, include armories, forts, and a training school. Armories are designed to serve as training and marshalling centers for the New York Army National Guard and the New York Guard. They are highly specialized structures often occupying an entire city block. Because of their imposing physical presence, the influence on the fabric of a neighborhood can be very strong. Fifteen armories built before 1940 serve as district and borough centers.
- Post offices are represented by 15 buildings, 1.9% of the Inventory. The inclusion of so few of this type of building is a result of two facts: the recent consolidation and modernization programs and the rental policy of the postal service organization.
- Twenty-six additional buildings in the Inventory, or 3.4%, include some not built to serve a government function, but which now are public property. These have come into city ownership through the urban renewal process or through tax default proceedings. They include churches, office buildings, and loft structures.

In summary, two distinct patterns of buildings emerge: buildings dispersed throughout each borough and serving a narrowly local function; and buildings housing specialized services or administrative functions serving borough or city-wide functions. Most of the buildings in the first category are single buildings set into the fabric of the city, whereas many specialized

services are housed in groups of buildings which often stand apart from the city fabric surrounding them.

Location

The location of public buildings is summarized in Table 3-2. Of the public buildings selected for the Inventory, the Bronx contains 110 (14.5%). It has a population of 1.5 million. Brooklyn contains 183 buildings (24.1%). It has over 2.6 million inhabitants. Manhattan, with a population of 1.5 million, contains 253 buildings (33.3%). Queens, with close to 2 million inhabitants, contains 134 buildings (17.6%). Staten Island contains 80 buildings (10.5%). It has a population of about three hundred thousand.

- In the Bronx, over 76% of the buildings serve local functions. Schools are most numerous, as they are in all the boroughs. Several large medical complexes serve the entire city, such as the Veterans Administration Hospital. With the exception of Staten Island, the Bronx has the largest number of hospital buildings built before 1940.

Structures for recreation and cultural facilities are well represented with city-wide facilities such as the Bronx Zoo and the New York Botanical Gardens.

The Bronx has the largest concentration outside of Manhattan of buildings built before 1940 devoted to higher education. The campus of Bronx Community College (formerly N.Y.U.) and the State Maritime College at Fort Schuyler are major examples.

- Brooklyn is notable for, among other things, the concentration of State Armories. There are six of them throughout the older sections of the borough. There are also several large specialized hospitals, serving as teaching and training centers, such as at the Downstate Medical Center and the Kings County Hospital Center School of Nursing. Unusual in Brooklyn is the high quality of the design of fire stations, recreation buildings, police stations, and public libraries.
 - Manhattan has the largest grouping of government facilities, universities, and recreation and cultural facilities. Only 14.6% of its buildings are schools, although the proportion of fire houses (14.1%) and police stations (6.3%) are similar to those of its adjacent boroughs. However, Manhattan has the largest number of public libraries. Hospitals represent a lower proportion of buildings (10.7%) than in any other borough. Many more hospital buildings are concentrated in large complexes such as at Bellevue Hospital and at Goldwater Memorial Hospital on Roosevelt Island.
- The largest number of administrative and judicial facilities is in Manhattan, 27 out of 55. They represent 10.7% of the buildings in the borough and generally serve the entire city. Twelve out of 32 university and college buildings are also in Manhattan, as are 33 out of 84 major recreation and cultural facilities.
- Queens has the highest proportion of schools, 34.3% of the borough total, and fire stations, 15.7%. The majority of public buildings are concentrated in the older portions of the borough and along its major arteries. Over 77% of its buildings are devoted to serving local functions.
 - Staten Island is notable for the concentration of hospital facilities built before 1940. The hospital buildings, which account for 33.4% of the borough total, are concentrated in a few very large complexes, including Seaview Hospital and Home, the U.S. Public Health Hospital, and Willowbrook Developmental Center. Borough administrative and

judicial facilities, over 7.5% of the public buildings in this borough, represent a higher proportion than in any other borough except Manhattan. Many of these buildings, together with schools, libraries, and health centers, are grouped around the historical center of St. George.

In summary, the historic pattern of growth in New York City is revealed through the location of its public buildings. The administrative center of Manhattan is surrounded by the more residential character of the adjacent boroughs. Staten Island's relative independence and later development is reflected as well in this pattern. Public services follow population and contribute heavily to the stability and maintenance of neighborhoods.

Age

A summary of building periods for each borough and for the city is presented in Table 3-3. The periods during which different facilities were constructed are summarized in Table 3-4. The major period of construction of public facilities spanned 60 years beginning in 1880. During this time, 94% of the buildings selected for the Inventory were built. Although sustained growth of government facilities began in the early 1890's and continued through to the 1940's, there were several periods of intensive construction. The first was between 1900 and 1915, and the second was between 1925 and 1940. During these years, which represent 50% of the major time span, over 66% of the buildings were built.

In Manhattan and Brooklyn, the older two boroughs, major construction took place between 1890 and 1915. During this 25 year period, 50% of the buildings in Manhattan and 56% of the buildings in Brooklyn were built. Construction in the Bronx accelerated in 1895. The years of most intense activity were between 1900 and 1905 and between 1920 and 1930. Forty percent of its buildings were built in those 15 years.

The major period of public construction in Queens began in 1920. Sixty-two percent of its buildings were put up between 1920 and 1940.

Staten Island had a period of relatively low volume and uniform intensity of public construction, except for the years between 1930 and 1935. Staten Island has the largest proportion of buildings constructed before 1880, 21% of its total. Some date from the 1830's. Major development of public facilities followed the population growth after World War II.

The construction of facilities by individual agencies generally follows the major growth periods of the city. Between 1895 and 1915, 50% of the schools, 73% of the fire houses, 80% of the libraries, 47% of the police stations, and all of the State Armories in the Inventory were built. During later periods, additional neighborhood facilities were constructed as were medical, recreational, public works, and university facilities.

In summary, although the buildings in the Inventory represent less than one half of the extant public buildings built before 1940, they are representative of the major trends in the growth of New York City. The periods of construction reflect the formation of communities at the turn of the century, the consolidation of government administration in Lower Manhattan and in the borough centers, and the practical recognition of the growing service needs of neighborhoods.
